CHAIRMAN OF THE JURY WIOLETTA MIŁKOWSKA (Poland)



Professor with post-doctoral degree Wioletta Miłkowska runs the class of choral conducting. She has graduated from the Instrumental and Pedagogical Department of F. Chopin Academy of Music, Branch in Bialystok. She has also finished the Postgraduate Studies in Master Choral singing in Bydgoszcz. Her activities with UMFC started in 1990. In the years 2012-2016 she held the position of the Head of Choral Conducting Unit, and between 2016 and 2020 she was a member of the University Research Board. Then in 2020-2024 she has become a member of the Artistic Discipline Board in UMFC.

FESTIVAL

She has been a conductor and an artistic leader of choirs in Białystok: the Technical University Choir, the District Police Headquarters Choir, the Pronar Choir, giving concerts in Europe, Canada and the USA, winning many prizes at festivals and competitions and being invited to jury boards of national

and international choral contests.

Wioletta Miłkowska is also involved i research activities, especially in funeral musical pieces. Her scientific results and conclusions have been presented in a dissertation entitled "Requiem in the creations of Polish composers". She is an authoress and a scientific editor of various book publications and articles concerning Polish choral art.

She has been a head and a co-organizer of various national and international scientific conferences such as "The national current in the artistic output of Polish composers", "Between the unknown and the forgotten. Polish music in the light of new discoveries", "In the circle of Polish choral singing", "Orthodox music. The traditions and the presence."

For the last 30 years W. Miłkowska has been an animator of the youth choral movement in Podlasie District. In the years 2006-2014 she was an activities coordinator in the All-Polish project for development of school choirs "Singing Poland" presenting the image of functioning of school choral ensembles in her publication called "Białystok in 'Singing Poland" (2011). For a few years she has been performing with children and youth choirs within her own educational-artistic project called "Singing Białystok". She is also a co-founder of the International Choir of the Baltic Sea with which she puts in practice her artistic ambitions.

Awarded with the prizes of Rectors of Białystok Technical University and of UMFC, honored with the Medal of National Education Committee and the Statue for Heart-Smart Teachers, for her achievements she was decorated with the Medal for Merits for Polish Culture, and the Medal for Merits for UMFC. In 2017 she received the Artistic Prize of the Białystok President, in 2018 – the Award of Gloria Artis by the Ministry of Culture and National Heritage, in 2020 – the Knight's Cross of the Polonia Restitute Order for the merits in development of art and culture.
